


# Servy expands into Canada




The service is offered in English and French, marking it the first multilingual Grab Airport Marketplace launching this year

[Servy](#), the enterprise self-service platform for hospitality, has launched its first airport program in Canada at [Montréal-Trudeau International Airport](#) (YUL). The partnership sees the launch of mobile ordering via the Grab Airport Marketplace and marks Servy's entry into 13 countries, spanning Europe, the Americas, Asia Pacific and the Middle East.

The platform, which launched this month, is present in nine restaurants across the airport, including Archibald Microbrasserie, UBar and Pork & Pickle. In the longer term, it is expected that 40 stores within the airport will be a part of the lineup.

The Grab Airport Marketplace gives travelers the option to order food and beverages from their own device, making the airport experience safer and more convenient by reducing touchpoints.
